Our vision for all our pupils is that we wish them to be able to *aspire, collaborate, inspire and care* so that they can be the best they can be. In order to achieve this, we believe that it is important that pupils come to school feeling that they belong, are equal to their peers, are safe and feel comfortable. It is our aim that our uniform policy supports this view. In addition to this, we aim to have the highest standards in our school and expect pupils and staff to take pride in belonging to our community. We believe that uniform guidelines help support pupils to prepare for future schooling and future rules in the workplace. Finally, we teach pupils to respect all rules and we believe that following uniform guidelines supports this.

What do we expect?

We expect pupils to look smart and tidy and to select their daily uniform from the list below. Whilst logo items can look smart, we do not expect parents to pay for any logo items and encourage families to shop around for cheaper items.

School bags

- Book bags can be purchased at one of the Year R parent evening meetings and can be used until the end of Y2.

Reception and Years 1/2: Please do not send your child with a rucksack/backpack or any other bag.

Years 3-6: A small backpack is allowed.

Accessories

In addition to the daily items, pupils are permitted to wear the following accessories:

- One small pair of stud earrings (these must be removed for PE)
- Watch: NOT a Smart watch. Fitbits can be worn at the owners risk.
- Discrete, plain headbands and hairbands preferably a dark colour such as black, grey or blue

What is not acceptable?

Pupils are **not** permitted to:

- Wear additional jewellery
- Wear make-up, nail varnish or false nails
- Come to school with dyed/coloured hair, shaved hair styles or fashion hair styles. This includes no designs in the hair, tramlines or undercuts of any sort.
- Wear heeled shoes, fashion boots or trainers.



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Helping with costs

We appreciate that buying and maintaining uniform is costly. In order to support with this, we promote the following:

- Please clearly label all items your child wears to school. Each year a lot of items of clothing end up in our lost property without a name and are not claimed.
- As stated above, parents should not feel that they need to buy costly items with the school logo on.
- Both schools run sales where parents can purchase second hand uniform very cheaply.
- Please donate any items your children have finished with to the school via the office, so that we can sell them on again.
- Where we can, we will help families with costs and please speak to the school office or the Head of School, if you need some financial support as we may be able to help you.

Noncompliance

We expect all our pupils to wear the expected uniform and believe that within the daily list there is choice for all. If for some reason your child is unable to come into school in the correct uniform (for example, shoes have broken) then please speak to a member of staff so that we are aware.

Should a child not be wearing the correct uniform without an explanation we will talk to them in the first instance and remind them of our expectation. Following on from this we will call the parents to discuss the issue. Sanctions may be applied where necessary such as a missed break time.

If you are experiencing any other difficulties in supporting your child to wear the uniform, then please contact the school and we will support with this.

Specific requests

Should you wish to request an adjustment to the policy, then please contact the Head of School who will be happy to meet with you. For example, if your child has a sensory issue or for a religious reason.

Complaints

To date we have not had any formal complaints about our uniform and most concerns are usually sorted by speaking to a member of staff. However, should you feel that



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you would like to make a more formal complaint then please speak to the Head of School in the first instance. You can also find a copy of our Complaints Policy on our website.
